
A Penn State for You

Here's how the 2+2 plan works for most students: first two years in a small college atmosphere at a campus other than University Park; final two years in the large, major research university setting at University Park completing your degree.

While University Park is the largest campus and widely recognized as Penn State's flagship location, more than 30,000 students attend classes, conduct research, join clubs, and compete in team sports at campuses other than University Park. Many of those students participate in the **2+2 plan**.

APPLYING TO PENN STATE

Admission Checklist

To complete your application for review for admission, you will need to submit the following:

- 1 Your online application
- 2 A copy of your Self Reported Academic Record (SRAR)
 - —secondary school records only if required for your educational system
- 3 English proficiency. All international students whose native language is not English must provide proof of language proficiency in any **ONE** of the following ways:
 - —A minimum TOEFL score of **80** on the Internet based exam
 - —A minimum IELTS score of **6.5** on the academic test
 - —SAT score of **570** or higher on the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing Section
 - —ACT score of 24 or higher on the English section
 - —IGCSE score of ${f A}$, ${f B}$, or ${f C}$ on the English language exam
 - —IB score of 5 or higher on the English exam
 - Certification through Penn State's Intensive English Communication Program
- 4 Official SAT/ACT scores
- 5 \$75 nonrefundable application fee
- 6 An official copy of your postsecondary (university) school records (if applicable)
- 7 A certified, line-by-line English translation of original postsecondary school records (if applicable)
